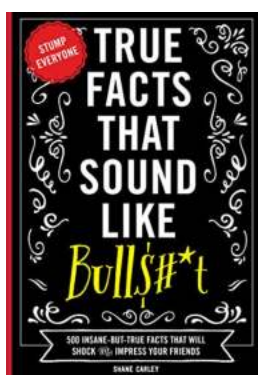

17. Ants can lift objects that weigh up to 50 times their own body weight.

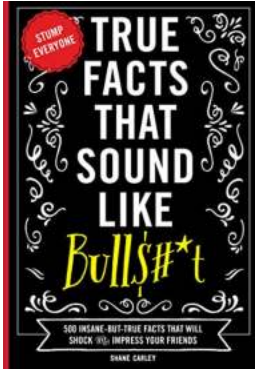
18. The current largest volcano on Earth is Mauna Loa in Hawaii, which rises about 13,700 feet above sea level.
