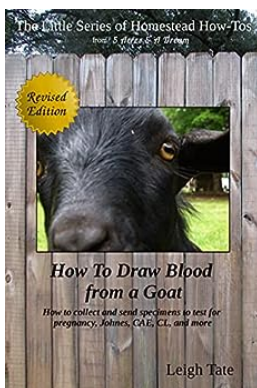

- Needles (18 to 22 gauge)
- Syringes (3 to 12 mL)
