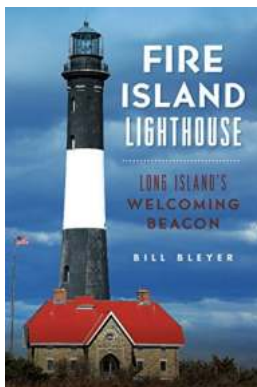

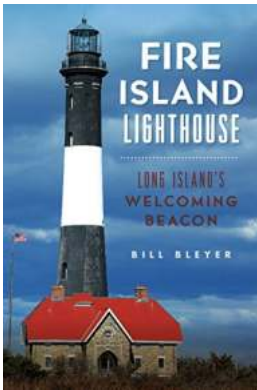

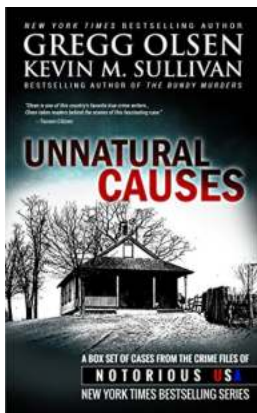


The first Fire Island Lighthouse was constructed in 1826 after numerous shipwrecks along the barrier island.
