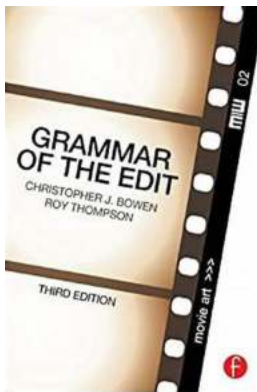
The book is direct, with no-bull or filler and is easy to read and put into practice.
