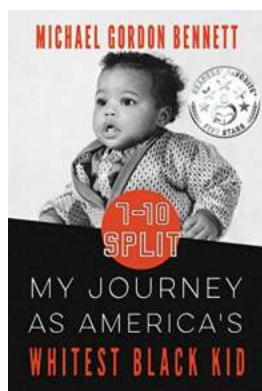


My Journey As America's Whitest Black Kid
