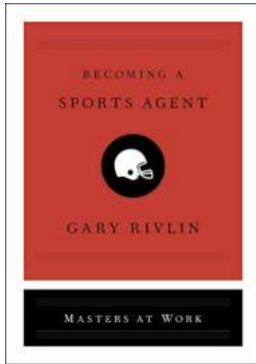
New Bern was a valuable port city during the Civil War and the Confederates made many attempts to reclaim it.
