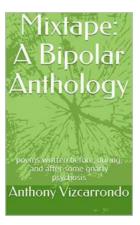

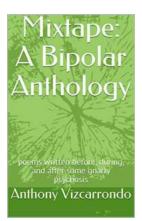

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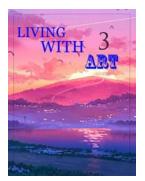

As long as you feel something, I did my job. Thank you!



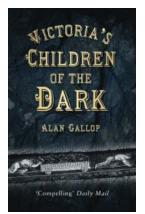
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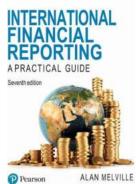
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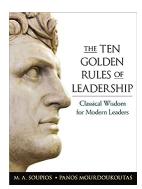
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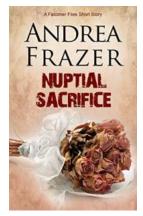
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
