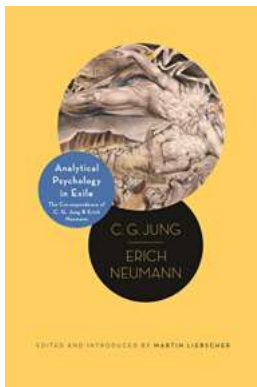

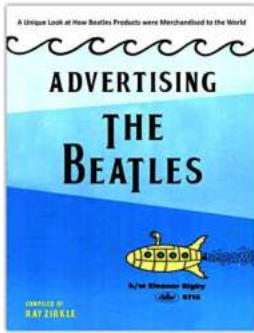


Two giants of twentieth-century psychology in dialogue
