The Mammy is an idealized figure of a caregiver: amiable, loyal, maternal, non-threatening, obedient, and submissive. On occasion, the mammy was also depicted as a sassy woman. She is devoted to her owners/employers and her primary goal in life was to care for their needs.

Magical Negro

The Magical Negro is a supporting stock character who, by use of special insight or powers often of a supernatural or quasi-mystical nature, helps the white protagonist get out of trouble. He is patient and wise, often dispensing various words of wisdom, and is "closer to the earth."

- John Coffey (Michael Clarke Duncan) in *The Green Mile* (1999)
- Oda Mae Brown (Whoopi Goldberg) in *Ghost* (1990)



Jezebel or Sexpot

The Jezebel is seductive, alluring, worldly, beguiling, tempting, and lewd. Historically, white women, as a category, were portrayed as models of self-respect, self-control, and modesty - even sexual purity, but women of color were often portrayed as innately promiscuous, even predatory.

- Carla (Shelley Long) in *Nine* in 2009



Thug

The Thug stereotype depicts people of color as criminals and dangerous. Hispanic and black males are often depicted as gangsters or criminals in film and TV.

- Any role with Danny Trejo in it



Sapphire

The Sapphire stereotype is also known as the Sassy woman or the Angry Black Woman. It stems from a belief that women of color are not only more expressive, but more opinionated, harsh, have bad attitudes, are loud, and generally negative and rude in nature.

- Queen Latifah in *Set It Off* (1998)
- Monique in *Hair Show* (2004)



Latin Lover

The Latin Lover is a stock character of Hispanic origin who is incredibly suave, sexy and skilled in the sheets. But this isn't always positive portrayal as male Latin Lovers are often depicted as "greasy" and sexist ("macho").

- Rudolph Valentino in *The Four Horsemen of the Apocalypse* (1921)
- Marcelo Cardona in *Beverly Hills Chihuahua* (2008)



Best Friend

This is a character whose role either revolves almost entirely around the main white character or serves as a conscious effort for a white character writer to appear inclusive. Sometimes known as the "token" minority character.

- Bibba (Mykelti Williamson) in *Forrest Gump* (1994)



Noble Savage

A character who is, due to their race or ethnicity, a member of a "barbaric or savage" tribe (perceived as such by others), and because of it portrayed as nobler or of higher moral fibre than the norm.

- Katsumoto (Ken Watanabe) in *The Last Samurai* (2003)
- Pocahontas in *Pocahontas* (1995)
